A man once writing said "that wastage was a law of the universe". How many a flower wastes its fragrance and beauty in uninhabited areas. How much sunshine is wasted on the desert sand, etc, etc. There may well be a measure of truth in this, but to wholesome-living, careful people wastage is deplorable. How often do we all have our little grouse at the way in which money is spent on an international, national, or perhaps local level? "It is a waste of money" we say; this may or may not be true. How prudent is the man in business to see that there be no excessive leakage or unnecessary expenditure, which would waste his financial resources. The housewife is watchful over her purse, she saves the odds and ends of food and transforms them into an attractive, appetising "made-up" dish, that they be not wasted. We endeavour to train our children not to waste. "Waste not, want not" has often been said.

All this is excellent and should characterise us all, but the same principles should be operative in spiritual and church life, but sad to say so often they are not. No doubt we can all turn our eyes to some who once ran well, but are now backsliding, such have not only ceased to help in

the Lord's work but are actively engaged in hindering it - what lamentable wastage. Some Christians become worldly. Worldliness is disloyalty to the Lord, it drains away a great amount of time, money, strength, talent that should be pressed into the service of Christ. The world is very sinister, and many have been ensnared. A writer in the Christian press recently said that the church contained many successful failures - Christians who succeed in secular matters at the expense of spiritual prosperity and usefulness. This for a Christian is wasteful living. Unused talent is another great source of wastage. When talent is shut up in the pew it is hindering the Holy Spirit from doing His work through the gifts which He Himself has bestowed. This is literally to throw away, to squander that which God has placed within us. Serious wastage indeed.

In church life today, there is much that Spurgeon called spiritual tom-foolery - elaborate side-shows which have very little bearing on either making, or helping a Christian. Then there are meetings which have become an end in themselves. If when we come together, there has not been a seed-thought of Divine Truth implanted in our minds, or we have not been helped to believe or to obey better, or the Lord has not been made more precious to us, or we have not resolved to put something right in our lives, then we are meeting, for meeting's sake - this too is waste, superfluous, unproductive.

Bible study - are we storing? What are our resources? Are we charged with the Truth of the Word of God?

<u>Praying</u> - Definite business with God. Here, His sway over our hearts and lives is extended. Here, the forces of evil are hindered, here we are spiritually energized.

Lack of concentration on these things spells wastage. To <u>every</u> believer God has entrusted His Truth and the ministry of intercession. Through these two things flow the energy and power of the Spirit. May we as a company of believers meeting together at North Road be very deeply concerned that we do not live our lives, or come together, to no real purpose.

Swiftly and surely comes the day When I shall keep a tryst, The focal point of all my life, The judgement seat of Christ. Shall I approach that throne with dread, With fear and stark dismay? What will confront me, what be read, About me on that day?

I shall not stand, a prisoner Who waits with baited breath; To hear the sentence of the Judge, If it be life or death;
